# "Make a Joyful Noise" The Concept for Commemorative Art at the Gordie Howe International Bridge

The Gordie Howe International Bridge project team is pleased to unveil the artistic concept developed by contemporary artist Jordan Sook, that recognizes and commemorates the region's role as a destination for freedom-seekers of African descent leaving behind slavery and oppression by travelling the Underground Railroad to Canada.


Between 1800-1860, more than 30,000 refugees from slavery and free people of African descent used the network and routes of the Underground Railroad to reach freedom with many of them crossing the Detroit River to Canada.

Mr. Sook has developed a concept for a free-standing sculpture entitled "*Make a Joyful Noise*" that symbolizes hope and freedom for past, current and future generations.

The concept was influenced by the feedback provided to Mr. Sook by local community members from the Black, African and Caribbean diaspora. A sketch of the concept will be on display at Art Windsor-Essex, along with some of Jordan's Sook's original works, until fall 2024.

#### **Now Accepting Community Benefits Funding Proposals**

All \$23 million of the Neighbourhood Infrastructure Strategy funding will be invested in the host communities of Sandwich/west Windsor and Delray/Southwest Detroit before the end of the Design-Build period. Approximately \$5.5 million (\$3.3 million in Canada and \$2.2 million in the US) is currently available and the project team intends to assign a portion of this funding this year to support the expansion of existing projects and add new initiatives to the Neighbourhood Infrastructure Strategy.

The project team is facilitating two concurrent Calls for Proposals to identify investments, including:

- a call for high-value programming initiatives that align with community investment priorities and will bring lasting benefits to the residents of Sandwich/west Windsor and Delray/Southwest Detroit;
- a call for regional tourism and economic development initiatives, including events and programming that will deliver benefits for the Windsor-Detroit region.

There is specific criteria for each call and interested organizations are encouraged to attend an information session in July to learn more.


