QUARTERLY CANADIAN ENVIRONMENTAL UPDATE



Windsor-Detroit Bridge Authority (WDBA), Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) and Bridging North America (BNA) are committed to protecting the environment both on and adjacent to the Gordie Howe International Bridge site. A diverse approach is being implemented to limit any potential adverse effects on the natural environment, cultural resources, and neighbouring residents and businesses. Through daily inspections, several integrated environmental components are regularly assessed to determine the effectiveness of current actions and guide future improvements. On the Canadian and US monitoring and mitigation throughout the life of the Project, in accordance with commitments in the approved Environmental Assessment Report and Federal Screening Report in Canada and the Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) and Record of Decision (ROD) in the US.

WHAT'S HAPPENING

Read the latest quarterly Canadian environmental update below. This information covers activities from October 1 – December 31, 2023.

- Project recycling rate across all four project components is 62%.
- Energy efficiency programs implemented in Q1 reporting (January 1 March 31, 2023) continue at project site trailers.
- Indoor air quality monitoring and inspections of Port of Entry (POE) buildings continue to be undertaken.
- Regular outdoor air quality monitoring continued through this reporting period utilizing two permanent ambient air quality monitoring stations.
- Regular inspections of sediment controls were undertaken to ensure appropriate
 mitigations are in place to prevent dust. Ongoing dust mitigation included maintenance of
 mud mats and rumble strips at all entrance points, site watering (when feasible) and road
 sweeping. Ongoing sampling of excess soils is also being completed to identify off-site
 beneficial reuse locations.
- Construction of two new stormwater management ponds at the POE was completed.
- Landscaping work is ongoing throughout the POE.
- Sampling of excess soils is ongoing to identify off-site beneficial reuse locations.
- Hosted community clean-up at Malden Park in Windsor, Ontario.
- Received Environment Journal Brownie Award for Best Large Project.
- Received the <u>National Environmental</u>, <u>Social and Governance</u> (<u>ESG</u>) <u>Award</u> from the Canadian Council for Public-Private Partnerships (CCPPP).
