

Community Benefits Overview

Vision

The vision for community benefits is to deliver a series of initiatives, based on public input, that create measurable and positive results-based opportunities for the host communities.

The Gordie Howe International Bridge Community Benefits Plan:

- provides economic opportunities in the host communities
- contributes positively to workforce development programs, thereby improving economic inclusion
- delivers neighbourhood improvements
- ensures clear commitments and accountability from all parties for its delivery.

Over 300 local entrepreneurs and small businesses engaged in business development programming

Almost 1,000 trees planted in host communities



Ten art pieces installed in the host communities



Over 1000 local youth received supports through a programming partner

2025 Community Organization Investment



The Gordie Howe International Bridge team is now accepting funding applications for the 2025 Community Organization Investment initiative.

\$150,000 (CDN) available in Windsor and Detroit

- \$5,000 \$50,000 (CDN) per funding request
- funding will go towards events, programming and infrastructure improvements delivered by non-profit and charitable organizations

Apply by 4 p.m. on Wednesday, January 29, 2025.

2025 Community Organization Investment

Eligible Applicants

Organizations are considered eligible to apply if the organization is:

- a registered non-profit or charitable organization
 - if the applicant is not a registered non-profit or charity, a trustee/fiduciary organization that is a registered non-profit or charity must also be included
- located in or have a history of serving one of the host communities
- has experience implementing the deliverables detailed in the proposal
- has a reputation of successfully delivering upon commitments.
 Only one application per organization will be accepted.

Applications **will not** be accepted from individuals or for-profit organizations, however, applications from public sector foundations will be accepted.





Eligible Projects

Projects will be considered for funding if:

- The requested funds support events, programming or infrastructure improvements that provide direct benefit to the Sandwich/west Windsor or Delray/Southwest Detroit communities
- The funding supports a project that can be delivered between July 1, 2025, and March 31, 2026
- The funds requested are between \$5,000 \$50,000 (CDN)
- The proposed project aligns with one of the community investment priorities:



Additional Considerations

- Organizations that have received Community Benefits Funding are eligible to apply if the organization has satisfied previous reporting requirements.
- For infrastructure projects, enderings or drawings of proposed infrastructure and cost-estimates are required.
- A detailed budget breakdown is required for event and programming proposals.
- The lead applicant or trustee/fiduciary organization must provide proof of charitable or non-profit status.
- All applications must be signed by a senior staff person and board member who are authorized to sign on behalf of the organization.
- The project team reserves the right to offer funding in an amount that differs from the original funding request.
- Upon approval of funding, successful applicants will receive further information regarding grantee expectations, recognition and promotional and reporting requirements.

Ineligible expenses:

- Scholarships
- Deficit or debt reduction
- Overhead or operational costs
- Fundraising/sponsorship activities
- Advocacy or political activities
- Complete or partial purchases of vehicles

Projects/initiatives that could be considered religious may be considered if the proposed project is non-religious in nature and will provide benefits to the greater community.
